sent us the Timber Transport agreement we already have. It was noted that since DW Agri were replaced by JTM all reports have praised courteous drivers on sticking to speed limits, slowing down on approaching other vehicles etc. There was discussion on subsidence on Glen Road – Sue KS met with Council officials who pronounced the stretch of road affected by the subsidence as dangerous and have promised action. There was discussion around potholes on the Lannhall road & actions agreed. Sue KS reported discussions & actions regarding Robert Gladstone's forestry extraction on the Clone road going past Low Lann. Due to Appin extractions not being so numerous RG is extracting within the current agreement. Regarding Auchengibbert Wood extraction, Sue KS will contact Mike Grunwell as this is not to schedule (completion date was 30th September 2018) and ask MG to ensure extraction follows same rules as other yellow consultation route. **Actions agreed**.

- c) Summer Event CC Barbecue and Hall pub night. BBQ reported as a success although not many families came, and pub night not as well attended as normal, however it was noted that other events were happening elsewhere on same day. It was agreed to try and organise on a date when nothing else happening in future.
- d) Streetlighting Jackie reported that an internal shade has been fitted inside the globe of the street light opposite 1 Tynron Kirk, and while this is not covering the whole lantern it is effective in stopping direct glare into windows on the street.

6. Windfarms

- a) Sanquhar 2 Sue KS showed map of proposed new site of 58 turbines at 250 m high first of its kind in Scotland. Discussion regarding events so far regarding community consultation and reaction to the proposals. Penpont CC appears to be in favour but some Scaur Glen residents are opposed. D&G Council opposed to size of turbines. SNH opposed. However it was noted decision most likely would be taken at national level. Margaret Irving has received a letter from the company asking for details of her private water supply. Discussion re appropriate action for Community Council to take. It was agreed that a response should be sent to initial plans saying we have concerns and that an official response would be decided on after community consultation on revised plans. Consultation event proposed for 23rd October, however as this is not suitable for Tynron Hall it was agreed to go back with a proposal for a Saturday consultation, either the 20th or 27th October.
